Textured Pot Holders

A crochet pattern Merrian Holland

US CROCHET TERMINOLOGY



Tools & Materials

Mercerized Cotton Yarn, either **3 count** crochet thread or **4ply** yarn such as "Crochet & Craft Yarn by Crelando from Lidl" in **3 colours**

Alternative Yarn Options

<u>DMC Petra Perle Cotton 3 Count Thread</u> <u>Yarn & Colors Mini Must Haves</u>

Hook 2.75mm / C or 3mm

Yardage per potholder:

30g/75m/82yds

Key

beg – beginning

ch - chain

fpdc – front post double crochet

prev - previous

sc – single crochet

rnd(s) - round(s)

sl st – slip st

st(s) - stitch(es)

Finished dimensions:

Approx - 17cm/ 6.6" x 17cm/ 6.6"

Finished size & yardage will vary depending on hook size, yarn thickness & your personal gauge.

Written Instructions

Row 1: With Colour A, ch38; sk 1ch and working into the back ridge of the chain, make 1sc in each of the rem 37 sts. DO NOT FASTEN OFF



Row 2: Ch1, turn the work; 1sc into each of the next 36sts; when making the last st, change to colour B as follows: insert hook into the stitch, pull up a loop, drop Yarn A & finish the sc with Yarn B; cut Yarn A. *(36 sts)*



Row 3: Ch1, turn the work; 1sc into each of the next 2sts; make 1fpdc around the 3rd sc of row 1; (sk1 st, 1sc into each of the next 3sts; sk the next 3sts of rnd 1 & make 1fpdc around the 4th sc) 8 times; sk1 st, 1sc into each of the last 2 sts



Row 4: Ch1, turn the work; 1sc into each of the next 36sts; when making the last st, change to colour C as follows: insert hook into the stitch, pull up a loop, drop Yarn B & finish the sc with Yarn C; cut Yarn B. *(36 sts)*



Row 5: Ch1, turn the work; 1sc into each of the next 4sts; make 1fpdc around the 5th sc of rnd 3 (2 rnds down); (sk1 st, 1sc into each of the next 3sts; sk the next 3sts of rnd 3 & make 1fpdc around the 4th sc) 7 times; sk1 st, 1sc into each of the last 4 sts.



Row 6: Ch1, turn the work; 1sc into each of the next 36sts; when making the last st, change to colour A as follows: insert hook into the stitch, pull up a loop, drop Yarn B & finish the sc with Yarn A; cut Yarn C. *(36 sts)*



Rows 7-38: keeping to the colour sequence, repeat Rows **3-6** until your fabric is square. When you come to the end of row 38, you will not be changing colours, so make a normal sc in the last st. Fasten off



Border

Left side border: Turn the work to the right side, join Colour A in last st made in top left corner, ch1 &1sc in same sp; make 1sc through the middle of each st along the edge, catching 2 strands of each st; when you've made the last st, cut the yarn & pull the live loop open until the tail end pops out.

Right side border: gently pull all the tail ends to ensure none of the edge sts are loose; join yarn in bottom right hand corner, ch1 &1sc in same sp; make 1sc through the middle of each st along the edge, catching 2 strands of each st; when you've made the last st, ch10 & sl st in same st; fasten off the yarn.



Final Border Row

Join Colour C in the middle along the top edge, working through both loops, ch1 & sc in the same sp; make 1sc into each st along; in the 1st st along the edge, work through both loops of the st - sc, ch1, sc; then, working through the back loops only; 1sc into each st until 1 st remains; in the last edge st & working through both loops - sc, ch1, sc; 1sc, through both loops, into each st along the bottom; in the 1st st along the next edge & working through both loop - sc, ch1, sc; then, working through the back loops only; 1sc into each st until you reach the loop; working through both loops of the last st, make 1sc; work sc around the ch10 – between 12-14 st should be sufficient; 1sc into same st as join of loop; working through the both loops of the sts, 1sc into each of the rem sts along the top edge; finish off with a sewn bind off. Sew in ends, distributing evenly along the rows.









Finishing Off

Press with a damp cloth & hot iron to eliminate any curl.
